

Adair Lane

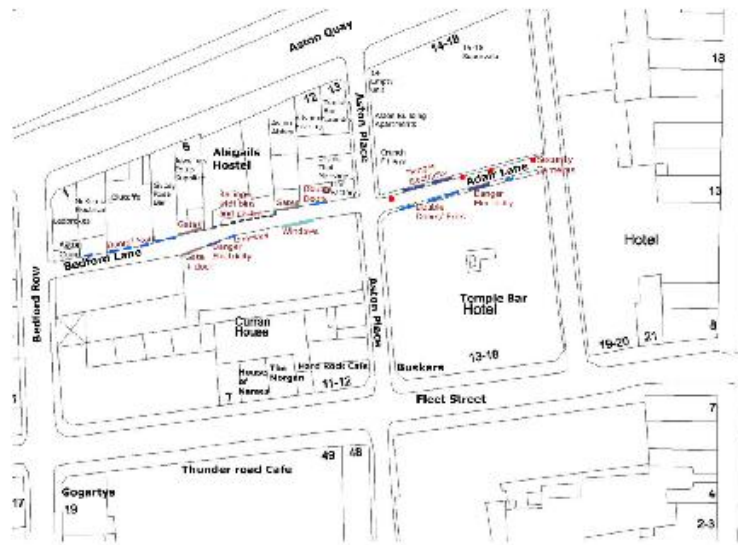
This lane is part of a large block between Aston Quay and Fleet Street near the eastern end of Temple Bar and is a fairly well used shortcut from Dublin's Quays to Temple Bar. You might know this lane from the 'Icon Walk' outdoor gallery, which starts on Princes Lane, runs west along Adair Lane, across Aston Place and through Bedford Lane. This walk features large murals on Irish cultural icons from music, poetry, literature, movies and sports, with artwork contributed for free by local artists who wanted to enliven these forgotten lanes. Come and take a stroll through Adair Lane to check out the iconic images of everyone from Father Ted to Thomas Crecan to Eamon Dunphy.

Challenge: *How can we build on the work of local artists to further activate this laneway and imagine new possibilities for what the space can do?*



Specifications

Adair Lane is about 4.5 metres wide and 40 metres long with a footpath along the north side and double yellow lines along both sides. There is lighting along one side of the lane. There is vehicular throughway and proposals would need to take into account the need for service access to the Temple Bar hotel and other businesses that back onto Adair Lane.
