Slevin steers Nurburgring to Hurdle success

Joseph O'Brien
trained 13-2 shot takes feature after controversial start

Jockey JJ Slevin steered a superb route to Guinness Galway Hurdle glory when Nurburgring dominated the famous €270,000 festival highlight yesterday.

In a race where there was almost as much focus on the start as the finish, Slevin and his cousin Joseph O'Brien combined for the 13-2 winner, who scored by seven lengths from Daawai with My Mate Mozzie repeating his 2023 third-place finish.

However, much of the post-race analysis revolved around the beginning to Ireland's most valuable handicap hurdle.

An original attempt to get the 19 runners off had to be scotched, following which a

standing start was attempted, only for one of Willie Mullins's eight runners, Anotherway, to get a flyer, closely followed by his stable companion Williams-towndancer.

Much of the rest of the field were immediately on the back foot, including Mullins's 5-1 favourite Daddy Long Legs who ultimately finished last.

Former champion jockey Davy Russell said on RTE that "50 per cent of the field has no chance after five yards" and that they probably shouldn't have been left go. Even Slevin was moved to describe the start as "a bit of a shambles".

It didn't prevent him being in the ideal spot just off the pace throughout and after getting a split at the top of the hill, Nurburgring looked the likely winner from before the second last.

Despite the brouhaha, the stewards decided no action was warranted and although starter Paddy Griffin described the scenario as "not satisfactory" he insisted it was a legal start and that co-operation between jockeys and the starter is a two-way street.



Not for the first time, Danny Mullins's anticipation skills were to the fore on Anotherway, but Nurburgring still emerged a decisive winner to give Slevin another big-race success.

An Irish Grand National success on Intense Raffles at Easter was followed up by a pair of Grade One successes at Punchestown and now a first victory for him in the summer feature.

"It's a very special race to win. The start was a bit of a shambles, but I got where I wanted to be, and Danny was parking up everywhere and doing his own thing. I let him roll along before the second last and he's done it well."

Slevin said.

The result continued O'Brien's excellent week with four winners, including Tuesday's Mile, making him top trainer here so far.

"He came here with the four-year-olds' allowance and really it was a fantastic ride from JJ. He got a good start, a lovely position and made a lovely move at the top of the hill. It was a very impressive performance," said the trainer who won the race in 2017 with Tigris River.

Winter Fog emerged best of the Mullins hopefuls in fourth and afterwards the champion trainer contented himself with

a diplomatic "not ideal" when asked about the start.

Nevertheless, there was a sad note to the day for Slevin and O'Brien as Semper, their runner in the opener won by Pink In The Park, was pulled up after the last with fatal injuries, a "bitter blow" according to the rider.

In the following Grade Three dash landed by Ashdale Bob, another horse, Merlin Giant, sustained fatal injuries in a fall at the sixth. The grim toll continued in the Listed Corrib Stakes as the Ballydoyle runner, Flight Of Fancy, had to be put down after being pulled injured in the dip. It came after fatal injuries to two horses on

Monday.

Jockey Gary Carroll rode a double, including the Corrib on Rainah, while racing finished with a 200-1 bookies' benefit through victory for Brave Crogha, a first winner in six years for local trainer Iggy Madden.

No big odds this time as Sirius bids for festival double

There aren't too many certainties at the Galway festival, but one sure thing is how Sirius won't be 50-1 for this evening's feature.

The Willie Mullins-trained mare was a huge outsider for Monday's Connacht Hotel Handicap, renowned as Irish racing's amateur Derby, only to wind up a spectacular winner for her owner/rider David Dunson.

Sirius came from last to first, circled the entire field, and still wound up beating Baltic Bird by 3½ lengths.

It wasn't as if the pace collapsed in front of her either, so plenty will jump on how she is technically Sils well in on readjusted handicap terms for the €110,000 Guinness Handicap over a mile-and-a-half.

Throw in an inside draw, as well as Shane Foley taking the mount, and Sirius will be widely

fancied to emulate Princess Zoe (2020) and Whiskey Sour (2017) who pulled off the same festival double.

Baltic Bird's connections will try to go one better this time through the ex-Mark Prescott-trained Eagle's Way, who impressed with a Ballyboden success last month and remains on the same mark.

The Durkin horses have been running well at Ballyboden this week and betting value could be

had in Eagle's Way taking them into the winners' circle.

The Friday date has turned into one of the busiest festival cards, with almost 31,000 squeezing into the track in 2019.

The bank holiday crowds can anticipate a hugely competitive jumps feature too as 20 line up for the €80,000 Galway Blazers Handicap Chase.

They include a trio of British challengers including the veteran Cap Du Nord, although condi-

tions may suit Whacker Clan whose trainer Henry de Bromhead is chasing a hat-trick of victories in the race.

Pulled up after a bad mistake in the Scottish National, Whacker Clan was previously a good third in Cheltenham's Kim Muir and relishes nice ground.

Andromeda can continue Aidan O'Brien's good festival in the mile-and-a-half maiden. The sister to Irish Guineas winner Peaceful should step up for her

return to action at Bellewstown.

Separately, Ryan Moore is in New York tonight to ride O'Brien's filly Greenfinch in the \$400,000 Grade Two Saratoga Oaks.

A Listed winner in Killarney on her last start, Greenfinch takes on six opponents in the 10-furlong heat. They include the likely favourite, Godolphin's Cinderella's Dream, who will be ridden by William Buick. The race is due off at 10.30 Irish time.

Applicant: Dublin City Council, Housing and Community Services.

Location: Site c. 1.72 ha at the former Bring Centre and Dublin City Depot Site, Collins Avenue, Whitehall, Dublin 9.

Proposal: Pursuant to the requirements of the above, notice is hereby given of the construction of 106 apartments on a site c. 1.72 ha at the former bring centre and Dublin City Depot site accessed via Collins Avenue Extension and Collins Avenue, Whitehall, Dublin 9. The site is bound to the north by the Shawen Business Estate and the Shawen Hall and Shawen Square, to the east by Cressfield Estate and Cressfield Park and Collins Avenue Extension Estate fronting Collins Avenue immediately opposite the site to the west and south. Development at the site will consist of the following:

- The demolition of the existing office building, sheds, warehouses and garages and site clearance works.
- Three apartment blocks comprising a total of 106 residential units and 375 sqm of community, arts and cultural space.
- Block A ranges from 3 to 6 storeys and consists of 50 no. residential units (22 no. 1 bed, 20 no. 2 bed and 8 no. 3 bed units) and 275 sqm of community, arts and cultural facilities at ground floor level.
- Block B ranges from 4 to 6 storeys and consists of 38 no. residential units (17 no. 1 bed, 9 no. 2 bed and 12 no. 3 bed units) and 100 sqm of community, arts and cultural facilities at ground floor level.
- Block C ranges from 4 to 5 storeys and consists of 18 no. residential units (10 no. 1 bed and 8 no. 2 bed units).
- 183 no. long-stay and 63 no. short-stay bicycle parking space, 57 no. car parking spaces and 8 no. motorcycle parking spaces.
- 1,025 sqm of public open space and 3,140 sqm of communal open space.
- One signalled vehicular access is proposed via Collins Avenue and Collins Avenue Extension.
- Provision of pedestrian and cyclist access at northern boundary to allow for future link via Shawen Business Estate and the Shawen Hall and Shawen Square.
- Boundary treatments and planting, public lighting, site drainage works, internal road surfacing and footpath, ESB meter rooms, stores, bin and cycle storage, plant rooms, landscaping; and
- All ancillary site services and development works above and below ground.

The proposal has undergone Appropriate Assessment Screening in accordance with Article 6(3) of the Habitats Directive 92/43/EEC and screening for Environmental Impact Assessment under the EU Directive 2014/52/EU, as amended by Directive 2014/52/EU.

In accordance with Article 8(1) of the Planning & Development Regulations 2001, as amended, the Planning Authority has made a determination and concluded that:
