



## **NOTICE OF PROPOSED ADDITIONS TO THE RECORD OF PROTECTED STRUCTURES IN THE DUBLIN CITY DEVELOPMENT PLAN 2016 – 2022**

Notice is hereby given pursuant to Sections 54 and 55 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended) that Dublin City Council proposes five additions to the Record of Protected Structures in the Dublin City Development Plan 2016-2022, in respect of the following structures:

### **Proposed Additions to the Record of Protected Structures:**

- 1. 19 Capel Street, Dublin 1**
- 2. 45a/46 Capel Street, Dublin 1**
- 3. 56 Capel Street including Mews structure to rear (known both as 56A Capel Street and 56 Jervis Lane Upper), Dublin 1**
- 4. 26 King's Inns Street, Dublin 1**
- 5. 16 Halston Street, Dublin 7**

The Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage has recommended the addition of the above five structures to the Record of Protected Structures.
