I wish to object to the proposed variation. Affordable housing and quality public space and green space should be the main focus of inner centre sites such as these that are close to public transport and other facilities...

My detailed objections are as follows.

- 1. It falls to provide for an adequate density of development in this site close to Dublin City centre. The general arrangement for sites such as these should be to provide for six floors of development with public uses on the ground floor street frontages.
- 2, It fells to provide adequate public and publicly accessible green space including sports fields, trees, parklands, play space and other green infrastructure,
- 3. It falls to provide a masterplan to give detailed guidance for such a significant and large land holding.
- 4. It would be appropriate to provide for a future light rall link from the Red Line to Cork Street and on to connect with the Green Line at Sty, Stephen's Green.
- 5. It falls to provide for an adequate number of housing units for a site of this size and location.
- 6. This proposal is incompatible with the stated aims and objectives of the Liberties Local Area Plan and Greening Strategy.
