I object to the plan of the superdepot in the Dublin 8 area, a better use of the space would be one that is beneficial for the residents of the area. Open space and recreation areas are a key component to quality of life for citizens and visitors to the city. Compared to other parts of the Dublin South Central Area Constituency, the Dublin 8/Liberties/Coombe area is seriously lacking in facilities for young people such as sports club grounds and houses, public swimming pools, community centres, youth cafes.

The council's Liberties greening strategy puts forward a vision for a network of new urban parks, with refurbished green spaces and play areas.

This is what the community want. We reserve our right to determine the kind of community we want and who our community is for. We wholly reject the proposal to locate what will essentially be a car park for stationary maintenance vehicles in the middle of our community. We want community facilities, housing and green spaces that will attract, inspire and sustain community life and provide our children with the kind of community they can flourish in. With the right kind of vision, this site has the potential to transform our area. This proposal does not represent such vision, in fact, this proposal is a further imposition on the less advantaged communities of the city of Dublin and, when one considers the scarcity of land in the inner city area, will limit the potential of the area and all of its residents well into the future if implemented.
