# Broombridge ETNS – Summary of Parents' Comments


The school distributed the survey to all parents, via their usual communications methods, during October 2021. Reminders were also issued.

# 1. Cycle Lanes and Routes

7 respondents, 29.2% of all comments received referred to this issue. The comments relating to this issue can be summarised as many parents and children feel that cycling to school is unsafe and would like to see more segregated cycle lanes outside the school and on routes to the school. Routes from Prussia St, Navan Rd, Nephin Rd and Carnlough Rd were among those specifically mentioned.

# 2. Footpaths and Walking Routes

6 respondents, 25% of all comments received referred to this issue. The comments relating to this issue can be summarised as there is too much dog excrement on the footpaths. Paths could be wider, particularly from the Luas stop.

#### 3. Junctions and Crossings

4 respondents, 16.7% of all comments received referred to this issue. The comments relating to this issue can be summarised as there could be crossings at the school (pedestrian crossings and lollipop ladies being suggested). Old Cabra Road and the Quarry Road/Fassaugh Avenue junction were also noted as problem areas for crossing.

#### 4. Motivation to Drive

3 respondents, 12.5% of all comments received referred to this issue. The comments relating to this issue can be summarised as that some parents need to driver for work reasons for dropping off kids to school. The drop-off area in front of the school should not be scrapped.

## 5. Parking Issues

3 respondents, 12.5% of all comments received referred to this issue. The comments relating to this issue can be summarised as cars parking on the footpath create a hazard and that there should be an assigned car park for parents.

#### 6. Front of School

1 respondent, 4.2% of all comments received referred to this issue. The comments relating to this issue can be summarised as there should be a safety zone and marked road similar to other schools.
