Proposed Draft Dublin City Council Parking Control Bye-Laws 2020

The Dublin City Council Parking Control Bye-Laws 2019 came into effect on Monday 1st July 2019. Dublin City Council adopted the Budget at its meeting on 25th November 2019. At this meeting it was recommended that there be an increase to the current hourly Parking charges. At the January 2020 meeting of Dublin City Council it was agreed that a public consultation process be initiated in relation to the proposed amendment to the Dublin City Council Parking Control Bye-Laws as detailed below.

The proposed amendment is as follows:

Fees for Pay and Display Parking

It is proposed to increase the charges in all zones across the city by an average of 10%. Again, to encourage motorists to use the Parking Tag App, they will be afforded a reduced rate. The rates for both Cash Customers and Parking Tag Customers are outlined in the table below:

<u>Zone</u>	<u>Cash Rate</u>	<u>Parking Tag Rate</u>
Yellow	€3.50	€3.40
Red	€3.00	€2.90
Green	€1.80	€1.70
White	€1.60	€1.50
Orange	€1.10	€1.05
Blue	€0.80	€0.70

The adoption of the Bye-Laws is a reserved function of the City Council.
